Maria enjoyed meeting the children and handed over some Christmas wishes, made by the children at GCF, and in turn received a number of drawings and colouring plates to take for the children in Margate.

In the beginning of January, two of GCF's Protective Behaviours facilitators spent a weekend in the area of Dannhauser, about five hours from Margate. KZN Christian Council, who was already familiar with excellent personal life skills safety programme, invited GCF to teach around 100 children from six different Sunday schools in the area, not only how to be safe, but also how to feel safe.

The children at the centre are back at school again. The holiday programme included various fun activities for them to be occupied with over the summer school holiday. Some of them were visiting their families for a few weeks and have now returned with the hope that they will go back for good soon. Other children were moving home to their prepared and rehabilitated families. GCF also assisted one of the long-term Child and Youth Care Centres in the municipality with host families from our database with approved foster families for some of the children, who do not have anyone to visit, while most of them went to relatives for the holidays. Reports state that they were happy and eager to visit them again when it was time for them to return to their centre.
